Offering Summary Sheet

Issuer: Farm Power Northwest LLC, a Washington limited liability company.

Maximum Approved Issuance: Up to 2,000 LLC Member Units at a price of \$375 per unit (\$750,000 in total units available).

Minimum Investment: The minimum individual investment is \$7,500 (20 units), but there is no minimum investment for existing members of Farm Power.

Closing Date: The Company expects to hold its first closing on August 15, 2010.

Use of Proceeds: The proceeds of this offering will be used to fund the development and construction of up to two anaerobic digester facilities. Other grant or loan funds will be necessary to complete even one digester, since the typical project costs about \$4,000,000. The most likely locations are near Enumclaw, Washington, and Tillamook, Oregon.

Class of Units: Farm Power has only one type of LLC Member Unit. There are no special investor classes, no warrants, and no options. Investors in this round will own a proportional share of all existing and future Farm Power projects.

Impound: All funds will be held in escrow at Business Bank in Mount Vernon until at least \$75,000 has been deposited and the Securities Division of the state Department of Financial Institutions has given written permission to release the funds. No interest will be paid on funds in escrow. If the company fails to raise the minimum amount of \$75,000 by December 31, 2010, all investments deposited in the impound account will be refunded.

Investor Limitations: All investors must reside in Washington State and have an annual income of at least \$50,000 or a household net worth of at least \$100,000. Or, if you do not reside in Washington, you must have a household net worth of at least \$1,000,000.

Yield: Farm Power plans to distribute a share of its taxable earnings equal to the highest federal income tax rate, since members will owe taxes on their share of the company's earnings. In its first year with taxable earnings (2009), Farm Power distributed to its members 35% of its taxable earnings, or \$12.12 per share on earnings of \$34.63 per share. Farm Power retained the rest of its earnings to invest in new projects. There can be no guarantee that Farm Power will continue to be profitable in the future. The board of managers has discretion over how much to either distribute or retain in future years.
